Slated Candidate for President-Elect:

J. Barry Frankenfield, FASLA, AICP, LEED AP

Barry Frankenfield has been employed by the City of Virginia Beach since 1985 when his first projects were the Atlantic Avenue and Boardwalk Revitalization projects in the Resort Area. Barry also worked in the City Department of Parks and Recreation where he was responsible for planning, design and development of all park, open space, golf course and bikeways and trails projects. Significant planning and policy efforts included the City of Virginia Beach Open Space Plan and City of Virginia Beach Bikeways and Trails Plan. In addition, Barry was the Executive Director of Lynnhaven River 2007 a non-profit corporation which worked with the city resources to improve water quality in the Lynnhaven River. Prior to working for the City of Virginia Beach Barry worked for Meade Palmer FASLA and Associates and MMM Design Group.

Barry is a certified Landscape Architect, a Fellow in the American Society of Landscape Architects and a member of the American Institute of Certified Planners and a LEED Accredited Professional. Barry also served as the Virginia Chapter ASLA Treasurer from 2007 through 2011.

Barry received a BA from the University of Virginia and a Master of Arts in Landscape Design from the Conway School of Design in Conway, Massachusetts.

Frank Fentress

Frank's involvement in the "green industry" in Virginia Beach began in the late 1970's when he worked part-time at a local nursery and landscaping business. He earned both a Bachelor of Landscape Architecture and a Bachelor of Science in Landscape Contracting from Mississippi State University in 1991, and became a Virginia Certified Landscape Architect two years later. Frank worked for many years in all facets of the private design/build landscaping industry, where he was responsible for hiring and personnel management as well as marketing, design, sales, contracting and oversight of landscape construction projects. In 1999, Frank was hired as the first Landscape Architect for the City of Virginia Beach and began his City career in the Landscape Management Division. He has worked in different capacities since joining the Virginia Beach staff, including several years with Parks and Recreation's Planning, Design and Development Division. He earned his Master of Public Administration in 2007 and is currently the Landscape Management Administrator for Virginia Beach Parks and Recreation.
